Nigel Farage's Reform UK has nothing to offer—except scapegoating

Reform UK pushes a politics that exploits ordinary people's anger and blames the cost of living crisis on refugees, Muslims and migrants. This is about trying to point the finger away from the bosses and the rich, who Reform UK's pledges will protect—and cut taxes for.

Migrants helped to build our NHS. Reform UK's policies are set to destroy it. Its general election manifesto laid out £50 billion of cuts to the NHS, the education system and social care.

People looking for a change from the cuts and political scandals shouldn't look to posh boys like its leader, Nigel Farage, a tax-dodging millionaire who attended one of the most expensive private schools in Britain. Reform UK's deputy leader, Richard Tice is a multi-millionaire CEO and ex-Tory donor. These are hardly men of the people.

Reform UK poses as a party on the side of ordinary people, yet pledged to cut taxes for the largest corporations in Britain. Reform UK MPs voted against the Employment Rights Bill which seeks to tackle exploitation, zero-hours contracts and fire and rehire for workers.

> Reform UK is riddled with racists. During the 2024 general election, Clacton campaign officials were exposed as saying migrants

should be shot on beaches. The party defended one of its candidates who said Britain should have "taken Hitler up on his offer of neutrality", saying the comments were "probably true". Reform MPs have also pledged the party would take Britain out of the European Convention on Human Rights and "repeal the hate speech laws".

Reform UK's whipping up of racism and Islamophobia gives confidence to racists everywhere, including supporters of fascist Tommy Robinson and those involved in the far right riots.

On one of Robinson's mobilisations last summer, the crowd was asked who had voted for Reform UK and a sea of hands followed. Senior Reform UK figures have also come to Robinson's defence since his arrest for repeating false claims against a Syrian refugee. Party chair, Zia Yusuf, has pointed to Marine Le Pen's fascist party in France as inspiration for Reform's future.

While Farage has been criticised for not spending time or holding surgeries in his Clacton seat, he was busy on the campaign trail with his friend Donald Trump in the US. He has said that Britain must "roll out the red carpet" for Trump, and praised his stance on immigration. Trump has announced plans to use the military to deport up to 21 million people in the US.
